THE MISSION of the Everychild Foundation is to ease suffering of children in the Greater Los Angeles area whether due to disease, disability, abuse, neglect or poverty.

## Everychild Grantees Making a Difference

*The Everychild Foundation is now in its 12<sup>th</sup> year of making grants in the Los Angeles area. Grants now total over \$9.5 million and serve more than 500,000 children.*

**2012 Centinela Youth Services**  
CYS was awarded its \$1 million Everychild grant in November 2011. Since then, the contract between Everychild and CYS has been signed, and work has begun on the Everychild Restorative Justice Center. The Center will move more than 1,200 South Los Angeles teens from the juvenile justice system into rehabilitative programs.

**2011 Boys and Girls Club of Los Angeles Harbor**  
The BGCLAH grant funds the expansion of the College Board Program to provide academic support to hundreds of youth. To date, 33 Boys and Girls Clubs have signed contracts for website access and training in implementing the program at their locations.

### **2010 South Bay Center for Counseling**

SBC is beginning year two of its youth career development initiatives for at-risk youth. Currently there are 168 students in the Education Career Pathway, 65 in the Urban Arts Career Pathway and 10 in the Energy Career Pathway. By mid 2012, the "7<sup>th</sup> Element Design Store" will be fully launched and the Urban Arts students will move into their entrepreneurial employment.

### **2009 St. John's Well Child and Family Center**

Through additional outside funding, the St. John's Healthy Homes, Healthy Kids program has been expanded beyond treating children at risk for environmental diseases to meeting the needs of the entire family. Now called Healthy Homes, Healthy Families, the program provides in-home case management, health education, housing assessments and tenant advocacy services.

### **2008 Mar Vista Family Center**

Today, more than 600 children and

teens benefit annually from activities held in the Everychild building, including college preparation, tutoring and homework; computer skills; sports, exercise and dance; and peer counseling.

### **2007 Heart of Los Angeles (HOLA)**

HOLA completed renovation of Lafayette Park Community Center and is providing regular after-school and summer programs in the Rampart District of Los Angeles. Recently, the Simon Bolivar Symphony Orchestra of Venezuela visited HOLA to conduct master classes and perform in the recreation center.

### **2006 L.A. Orthopaedic Hospital**

The universally accessible playground at L.A. Orthopaedic Hospital is still one of the few such playgrounds in Los Angeles. The facility, open to the public, is a center of activity for both the

neighborhood and for children visiting the nearby clinic facility.

#### **2005 Hillside**

Youth Moving On, Hillside's successful program for youth transitioning out of foster care and probation, continues to provide affordable housing and support services for up to 28 youth per year. Youth can stay in the apartments and assume the lease as long as they pay their rent on time.

#### **2004 Optimist Youth Homes**

Started in 1906, Optimist Youth Homes and Family Services used its grant to build a learning center for at-risk probation youth. Today, the center is used to help youth achieve their academic goals.

#### **2003 Violence Intervention Program**

VIP's Everychild Foundation Center for the Vulnerable Child provides 24-hour, 7-day a week forensic and medical evaluations for any child who

may have been abused or is at heightened risk for re-abuse. Most of the children treated are in foster care or at risk for out of home placements and are living in poverty and/or some other high-risk situations.

**2002 Wonder of Reading**  
Our grant funded construction of 15 new public elementary school libraries, filled them with books and created a manual to teach others around the nation how to replicate the program. Additionally, it trained reading volunteers to work one on one with children.

#### **2001 QueensCare**

The Everychild grant funded mobile dental clinic was the first of its kind to serve L.A.U.S.D. schools, providing free dental care to low-income, K-6 students. Today, with three additional clinics, 20,000 dental procedures are preformed annually to meet the need.

### **Nancy Daly Salon Series**



Supreme Court Justice **Sandra Day O'Connor** spoke to more than 60 Everychild members and their guests on February 25. The salon focused on her efforts to increase civics literacy in children through iCivics, a free on-line program. The next salon is on **March 12<sup>th</sup>** and will feature two expert speakers on school bullying, **Laura and Kirk Smalley of Stand for the Silent.**
